Playground Favorites in 2022-2023

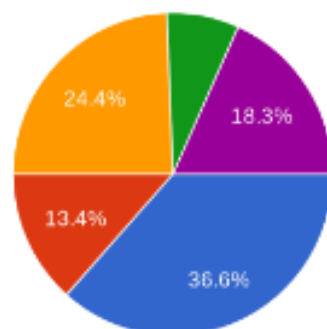

FAVORITE SUBJECT OF BCS STUDENTS

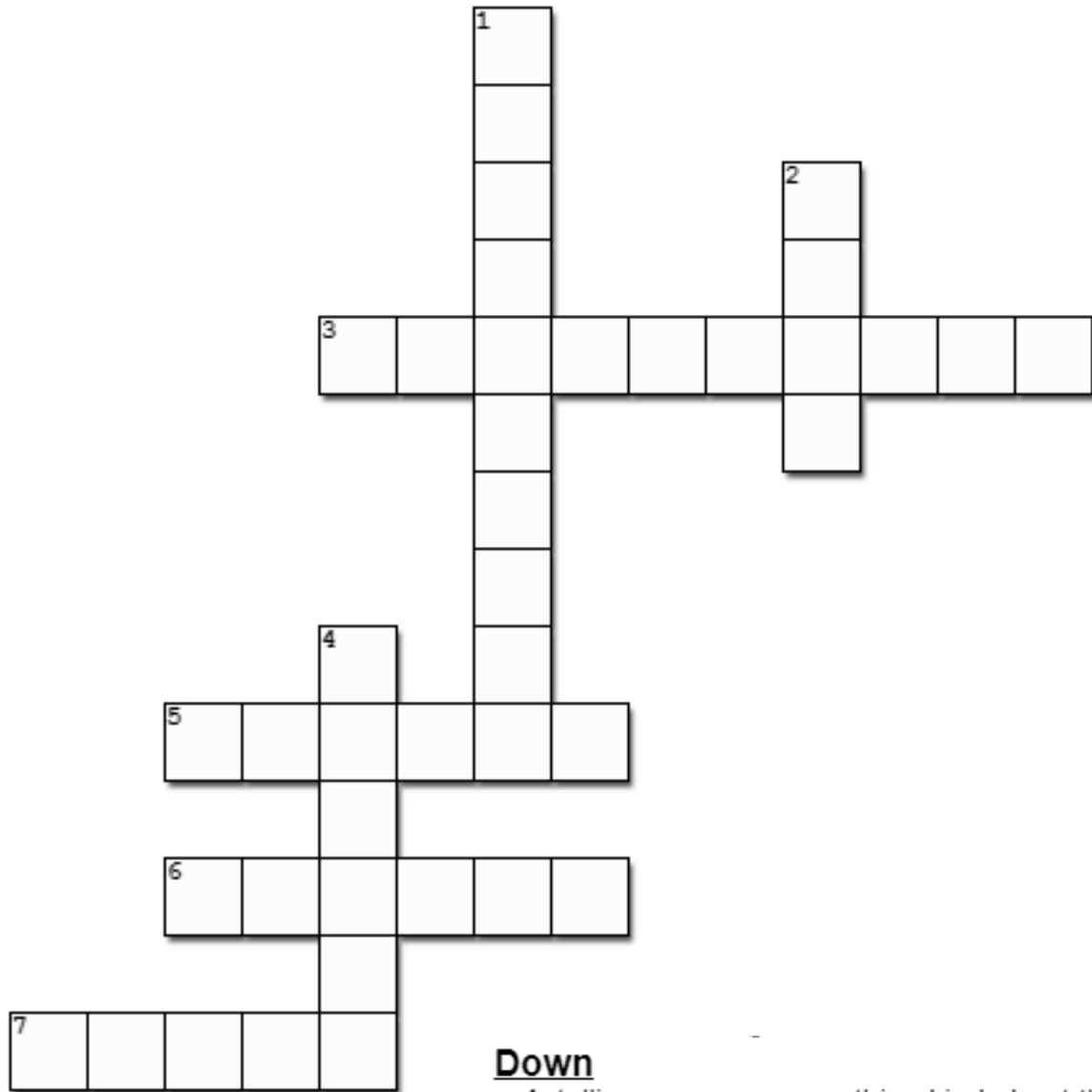
